Why Clearmac®

Clearmac® cold applied paving was specified by Cambridge City Council for this award-winning toilet block and installed during 2004.

Clearmac® was specifically chosen for its natural appearance and as it could be readily laid in sections defined by concrete edgings as part of the innovative octagonal design inspired by a fairground merry-go-round ride. The building won the Architecture for Tourism Award at the East Spirit of Ingenuity Architectural Awards 2004 presented by the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA).

This development is part of Cambridge City Council's four-year £1 million capital improvement programme to modernise toilets in the area. The previous building, located on the corner of Parker's Piece green, which was immortalised in a scene in Stephen Fry's book *The Liar*, had been a refuge for drunks and drug addicts.

Clearmac® has previously been successfully installed on many public sector paving projects in the Cambridge region and following the success of this project has been specified on a further development in Victoria Avenue.
