

# Clearmac®



### Material

Clearmac® cold-applied paving in grey granite (T310).

### Location

The Natural History Museum, Cromwell Road, London. The New Darwin Centre was opened by HM the Queen in November 2002.

### Why Clearmac®

A high quality surfacing was required for the paving areas in front of the building's entrance.

The design called for the finish to be in different shades of grey. The grey granite aggregate was offered to the architect and approved by the client as meeting the requirements of the design.

The clear binder used allowed the natural colour of the aggregate to give the finished required, as well as providing a hard wearing surfacing.

Clearmac® was laid in panels separated by polished grey granite paving. Cold-applied Clearmac® is ideally suited to this type of installation because it does not require compaction by heavy plant, avoiding the likelihood of damage to the other paving finishes
